

## COMPLETION OF STUDIES GRANTS FOR FOREIGN STUDENTS

The International Office of Hochschule Düsseldorf - University of Applied Sciences can award Completion of Studies Grants from funds made available by the DAAD. The prime objective is to enable high-performing foreign students to concentrate on their studies in the last phase of their programme (thesis, final exams) by providing financial support.

# NEXT CLOSING DATES FOR APPLICATIONS: 15 OCTOBER 2016

Eligible to apply are students of Hochschule Düsseldorf - University of Applied Sciences who are:

- Foreign nationals who have completed their school education outside Germany
- Enrolled at HSD with the objective of gaining a university degree
- Financially in need
- In the final phase of their studies (completion within a year)
- Resident in Germany during the final phase of their studies

#### NOT eligible to apply are:

- Exchange students
- Persons who are (also) German nationals or have obtained their university entrance qualification in Germany
- Persons who receive a full-time or part-time scholarship from the DAAD or another organization
- Persons resident abroad during the final phase of their studies

### Scholarship amount and duration:

• approx. 300 EUR per month; duration up to 3 months

#### **Application documents:**

- Application form completed in full, printed and signed
- Current Transcript of Records
- CV in tabular form
- Statement from the Examinations Office regarding the anticipated date when the applicant will complete his or her degree
- Copy of registration of the final degree thesis, if available
- Appraisal form (appraisal of the degree thesis) completed by a professor in the respective faculty
- Copy of your passport (only the page with your personal data)
- · Bank statements from the last three months

#### Selection procedure:

Beneficiaries are selected by a commission of representatives of Hochschule Düsseldorf - University of Applied Sciences on the basis of the (complete!) documents submitted. Selection criteria are, amongst others, good academic performance and the students motivation. Students do not have a legal claim to a scholarship.
